The evening covered the Web, social media/chat sites (e.g. Face Book, Club Penguin), mobile devices and cameras such as mobile phones and Play Stations. We also learned about cyber bullying and what to do about it.

It was also interesting to hear that banning our children from the computer wasn't seen as the answer (they'll just go on-line elsewhere without us knowing).
